

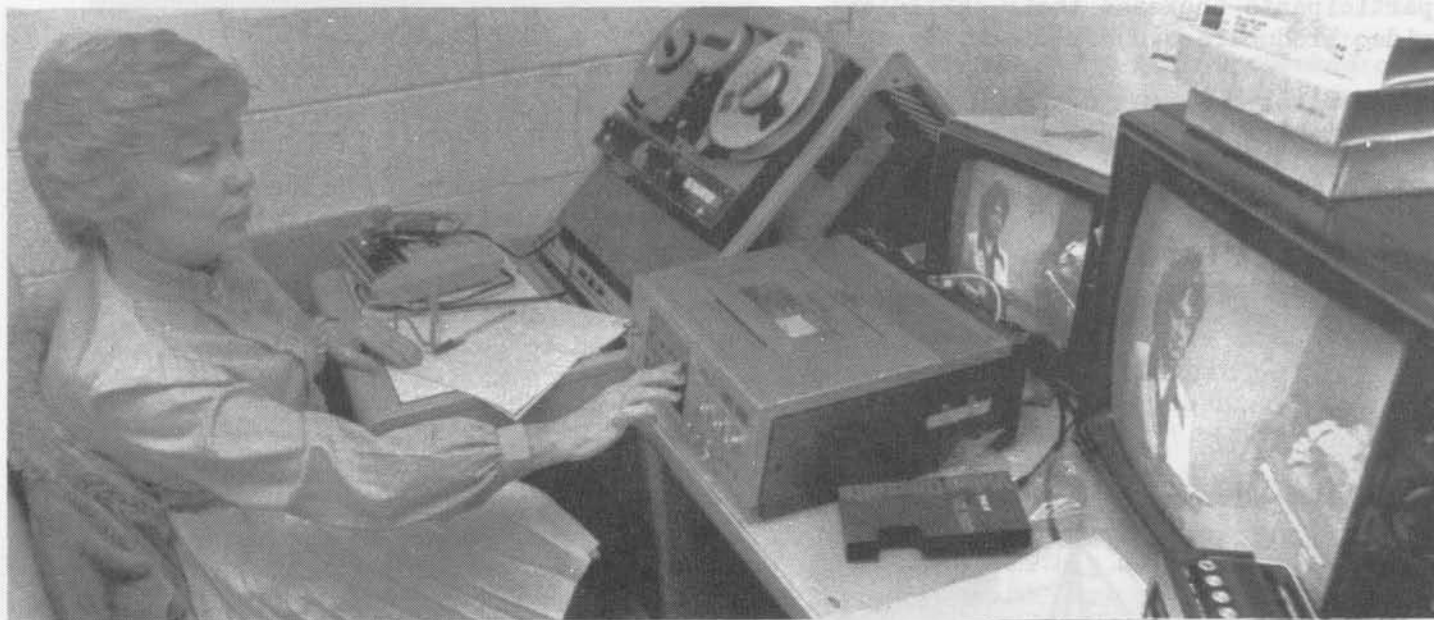

Editing facilities recently came "on-line" at Everyone's Television Channel (ETC 12). The system involves editing from a one-half inch cassette machine to a one-inch open reel machine provided by Channel 3 of Northern Cablevision, then back to the half-inch cassette. "And by golly," said ACCW coordinator Will Loew-Blosser, "you'd never know there's a third generation dub in there."

Shown using the new system, above, is Veryl Blomquist, producing the program "Search for Reality". The system will be available on a first-come, first-served basis, and editing classes using the new system will begin January 23.

New Classes Added

The Workshop Education Committee has added two new skill-building training sessions to its schedule of classes.

Portable Video Skills, part II is a second class for people who have completed Introduction to Portable Video. Participants in the class learn the theory of producing a single-camera production. Groups will produce a tape as part of the class, and the class concludes with a critique session.

Studio Production Skills, part II is a follow-up to Introduction to Studio Production. This class will help participants increase their skills as video producers and directors.

Youth Projects Grant

The Workshop Board of Directors recently submitted a preliminary Proposal for a 1982 Youth Projects Grant from the National Endowment for the Humanities. Our grant is designed to get young people involved in making a series of television programs about Anoka County History. The participants in the project will research, write, produce, direct and act in the programs. It will be up to the young people to determine what information concerning Anoka County history should be included in the series.

The structure of the project will be to have a coordinator responsible for contacting and organizing the participants and guiding them through the series. Current Workshop staff will provide video training.

We will not know until after the first of the year whether our preliminary proposal has been accepted. If it is, the full grant proposal will be written and submitted. Then it will be a few more months before the Workshop is told of its status. Hopefully, the project will start during the summer of 1982.

The second portable unit is a Panasonic camera with pistol grip and VHS deck that the Anoka County Communications Workshop purchased recently for \$1,500. That figure represents a significant savings over the normal price of such a unit.

To help defray the cost of the second portapak, Fridley civic groups have been approached for donations. The local United Auto Workers have donated \$200 towards that fund.
