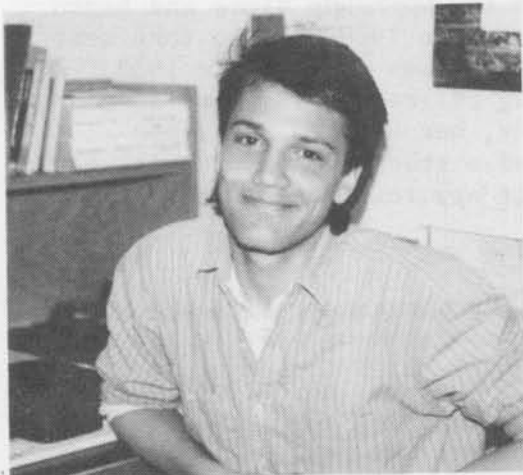


Michelle K. Glynn

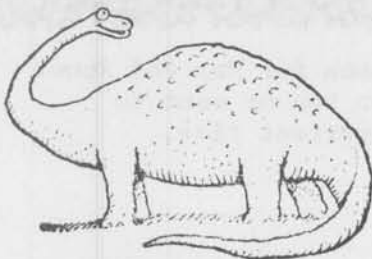
